PRESBYTERY STANDING C'TEE & PASTORAL RELATIONS C'TEE meet at Goonellabah 1<sup>st</sup> Tues morn each month.

Calling for you to nominate people to the Presbytery Standing C'tee & to the Pastoral Relations C'tee. Elections will be held at the next meeting of presbytery for the positions marked \*. (The other positions are elected later in the year.)

The membership of the SC shall be confirmed members or members-in-association of the Uniting Church including: (i) the chairperson of presbytery (Rev Chris Sparks)

(ii) the deputy chairperson of presbytery (Rev James Annesley)

(iii) the secretary of presbytery (Rev Maggie de Leeuw)

(iv) the treasurer of presbytery (Mr Bruce Robinson)

(v) the property committee convener (Mr Ian Imrie)

(vi) \*up to 2 people ensuring that the make up of the SC has a balance of lay and ordained people\*.

At present the 2 lay people are Mrs Barbara Whale (Yamba) and Mr Russell Playford (Casino). Both are available for reelection.

The membership of the PRC shall be confirmed members or members-in-association of the Uniting Church:

(vi) the chairperson of presbytery (chair of PRC) (Rev Chris Sparks)

(vii) the secretary of presbytery (Rev Maggie de Leeuw)

(viii) the ACOMP delegate (Rev Ken Day)

(ix) \*3 other people ensuring that the PRC is 50% lay people and 50% ordained people\*

At present 3 lay people are Mrs Lyn Davies (Murwillumbah), Mrs Olwen King (Alstonville) and Mr John Mace (Lismore). All are available for re-election.

The presbytery has the right to co-opt onto SC / PRC any confirmed member or member-in-association of the Uniting Church who is an active member of a congregation, and not necessarily a member of presbytery.

HOW TO NOMINATE SOMEONE:

Read the info on the presbytery website, or ask some one in your congregation to print it off for you. Each step is explained, and after you have had some time praying, you may choose to nominate someone.

Leaping into 2013 ... here's what some congregations are doing. (Want to know more about these ventures? Contact them directly, or through the presbytery, & we can put you in touch with the right person. But be warned: All these activities involved taking risks, and thinking of people outside the local church rather than maintain what always was. But what a fun ride these congregations are on!)

Brunswick Heads and Mullumbimby worship on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday morning of each month with the Anglican churches in their towns.

Mullumbimby have a Tuesday night option for worship and meeting together now, with Grace Space, and commencing in 2013 "God and me."

Bangalow have children and teenagers in their congregation, and 2013 will build on opportunities for these young people to grow as disciples.

Byron Bay will commence a Thursday morning worship and lunch option for people.

Lismore Regional Mission have amazing mission breakfasts, attracting many people from the community.

Maclean, Brooms Head, Lawrence, Brushgrove Rev. Alan Palmer will join the Maclean congregations in early 2013 as an intentional supply ministry to assist the church move through changes for future effective ministry.

Murwillumbah congregation worships with the other churches of the town on the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday night of each month.

Yamba have opened their op shop now and ready to roll in 2013.

Woombah is a new congregation and 2013 will be an opportunity to make next steps in ministry in their faith-venture.
