Alstonville and Rous Mill Enjoying ministry with Rev Christopher Barr. They have replaced their pews with comfortable seating. Their Presbytery support congregation is Lismore.

Ballina and **Lennox** Their Joint Nominating Committee (JNC) continues to meet, and an education process for calling elders and leadership is underway. They have just commenced a '3rd option' for people coming together. Up until now they have had 2 Sunday morning worship services. Their Presbytery support congregation: Alstonville

Brunswick Heads and **Mullumbimby** These congregations are the major fund raisers for ministry through the Wesley Methodist Church with deportees sent back to Tonga. Bangalow and **Byron Bay** Bangalow has moved it worship to Sunday 5pm, and now has about 12 children and teenagers attending each week.
